

Where can New Yorkers get Medicaid?



- ◆ Under 65, not eligible for Medicare
- ◆ Parents and caretaker relatives, regardless of age

Go To: →

- ◆ Certain New Yorkers **with** Medicare
 - Parent or caretaker relative, have Medicare
 - Pregnant and disabled, have Medicare
 - Under 19, have Medicare due to end-stage renal disease
- ◆ Other New Yorkers **with no** Medicare
 - Disabled adult, no Medicare
 - Under 26, was in Foster Care, have Medicaid on 18th birthday

- ◆ Aged, Blind and New Yorkers with Disabilities
 - Age 65 or older
 - Disabled, have Medicare
 - Blind
 - End-stage renal disease
 - New Yorkers needing long-term care
- ◆ Special circumstances
 - Currently in Foster Care
 - In an Adult Home, OMH (Office of Mental Health) Residential Care Center, or Community Residence
- ◆ Certain Medicaid programs
 - Medicaid Buy-In for Working People with Disabilities
 - Medicaid Cancer Treatment Program (MCTP)
 - Medicaid Spend-down/Excess Income Program
