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Wins & Losses



2023 Wins

- Fair Medical Debt Reporting Act banning reporting of medical debt on consumers' credit reports
- Uniform Hospital Financial Assistance Application
- Essential Plan
 - Included DACA recipients
 - Eliminated premiums

2023 Losses

- Coverage4AII
- Community Health Advocates funding
 - Assembly cut by \$738,000



End Medical Debt



Ounce of Prevention Act (S1366B|A8170A): Make it easier for patients to find out about, apply for, and receive hospital financial assistance.

- Offer payment plans to people up to 600% of FPL, using Medicaid rates
- Time limit payments at 3 or 5 years, based on consumer's income
- Require all NFP and government hospitals to offer HFA
- Ban lawsuits against patients < 400% of FPL
- Cap payments at 5% of a family's gross income

Stop SUNY Suing (A8170|S7778): The 5 State-run hospitals have sued 16,700 patients since 2019.

- Research shows they are suing low-income people of color, even people in jail without offering financial assistance
- They get over \$530 million annually in DSH funds for their uncompensated care costs

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Coverage Improvements

Improve health plan benefit design

- Adopt Governor Hochul's proposal to ban cost-sharing for insulin
 - 2.6 million NYers have diabetes
 - Research shows co-pays hurts RX adherence
- Adopt Governor Hochul's proposal to spend \$315 million of 1332 Waiver Surplus to improve cost-sharing for NYSOH plan (\$1.3b over 5 years)

Pass the NY Health Act to ensure that every New Yorker has access to coverage



Coverage4All



Coverage4All (S2237B|A3020B) would include low-income immigrants who are ineligible for the Essential Plan coverage because of their status:

- Providing health coverage is the right thing to do:
 - Improves everyone's health care & the over healthcare system
- Fiscal prudence:
 - FREE to NY the feds pay for it!
 - There's enough 1332 surplus (\$7.1 billion) to pay for immigrant coverage (\$4.9 billion)
 - Saves over \$400 million annually in state Emergency Medicaid
- Other States cover immigrants: Colorado, Washington (§1332), California, Minnesota & Illinois (Medicaid)



Medicaid Improvements



Kids continuous coverage (A8146|S7747)

 Adopt the Governor Hochul's budget which proposes to provide continuous coverage to kids from birth up to age 6

Asset test (A5940A|S4881A)

- People over 65 or who have disabilities are the only ones who face an asset test
 - Year 1: Change it to \$300,000
 - Out years: It would be eliminated



Consumer Assistance



Community Health Advocates:

- Last year CHA funding was cut by the Assembly (\$438 net)
- Executive budget maintains at \$3.5 million
- Calling on Legislature to maintain \$2 million additional funding (\$1 million from each house)

Navigators:

 New York should increase Navigator funding from \$27.2 million to \$38 million to reflect ten years without COLAs and fund outreach (\$5 million)
