

The impact of the federal policies on New Yorkers and the State's health care system



Nearly 8.6 million New Yorkers

including seniors, children, pregnant people, people with disabilities and low- and moderate-wage and part-time workers rely on Medicaid and the Affordable Care Act for their health care.

Federal cuts to health care will devastate New Yorkers, hospitals, health care providers, insurance companies, local economies, and our State budget.



COVERAGE LOSSES

1.7 million New Yorkers may lose their health coverage



1,241,000 currently enrolled in Medicaid

446,000 currently enrolled in the Essential Plan

- New Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services guidelines will also eliminate the State's ability to keep 750,000 children ages 0-6 continuously covered starting in 2027



RISING PREMIUMS

If Congress does not extend premium tax credits, set to expire at the end of the year...

- Health insurance premiums for those on the NYSOH marketplace will increase by **38%, or \$2,700 a year for a couple**, leading to many consumers having to go without coverage



STATE BUDGET

New York State will lose \$12.5 billion annually

from the loss of federal funding for the Essential Plan and Medicaid



HOSPITAL IMPACT

Hospitals will lose \$8 billion in funding, \$300 million for health centers

- This may force rural or safety-net hospitals to close, currently **18 rural hospitals are at risk of closure**

Cuts will also force **34,000 hospital jobs to be lost**
