The impact of the newly proposed House budget to the health care system on New Yorkers

Nearly 8.6 million New Yorkers

including seniors, children, pregnant people, people with disabilities and low- and moderate-wage and part-time workers—rely on Medicaid and the Affordable Care Act for their health care.

Federal cuts to health care would devastate New Yorkers, hospitals, health care providers, insurance companies, local economies, and our State budget.

Impact of federal threats to health care on New York State:



1.5 million New Yorkers would lose health coverage



1,241,000 were previously enrolled in Medicaid 224,000 were previously enrolled in the Essential Plan



The State would lose \$13.5 billion annually

from the loss of federal funding and shifted costs to the State to keep New Yorkers covered



New York Hospitals will lose \$3.2 billion annually from reduced reimbursements and uncompensated care losses

Impact of federal threats to health care on New Yorkers living in Congressional District 22:



33,400 on Medicaid will become uninsured

16% of the 206,800 constituents currently on Medicaid

4,600 on the Essential Plan will become uninsured

12% of the 37,100 constituents currently on the Essential Plan



Cuts will cause District 22 to lose \$300 million annually in funding

Hospitals in this district will also lose \$82 million annually in funding
